MEETING MINUTES OF THE PARKS COMMITTEE
OF THE VILLAGE OF SPRING GROVE
FEBRUARY 22, 2022

Council Chambers, Spring Grove, Illinois, February 22, 2022; a meeting of the Parks Committee was held this date at 6:42 p.m., at the Municipal Centre, 7401 Meyer Road, Chairperson McMahon presiding.

Call to Order. The following members were present: Chairperson Bob McMahon; and Members Mark Eisenberg, Jeff Letzter, Mike Lee, Pat Mazzanti and Tom Sanders – 6. Absent: Member Mike Gajewski – 1. Also present for the Village were Mike Niedzwiecki, Chief of Police; Laura Frumet, Deputy Clerk and Kelly Popelka, Deputy Clerk.

New Business.

Review Stateline Comets Field Usage Agreement. Chairperson McMahon recommended a change to the agreement as to the removal of one of the two porta-potties at Spring Grove Park after baseball ends on July 1st because Stateline Comets then only does scrimmages and practices. The porta-potty can be returned at any time if needed. Member Lee asked for clarification regarding the advertising opportunities at Thelen Park. Member Mazzanti moved, seconded by Member Lee to renew the Stateline Comets Field Usage agreement with the removal of one porta-potty after July 1st. Roll call vote: Ayes: Eisenberg, Lee, Letzter, Mazzanti, McMahon, Sanders – 6. Nays: None. Motion carried.

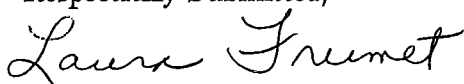
Public Comment. None.

Member Lee recommended, since the parks loan has been paid off that the payment remain in the budget so there are funds available for other parks projects, like Hatchery building siding. Chairperson McMahon noted that some time ago the east end side of Hatchery Park had a seawall installed to prevent erosion and that seawall will have to be extended north as that area is now eroding and that would take precedence over repairs on the Hatchery building. Member Eisenberg stated there may be grant money available for that repair.

There being no further business to discuss, Member Letzter moved, seconded by Member Sanders to adjourn the meeting at 6:54 p.m. On voice vote, the motion carried.
